Texas Holdem Tournament

3rd edition to be held on Saturday 29th of March 2025 at 2pm at Café Campestre. Tournament will be played on the final Saturday of every 3rd month thereafter.

Tournament registrations can be made in advance through Justin, Ben Slow or Ben Agnew with your minimum buy in of C\$500

Texas Hold'em Poker Tournament Rules

1. Tournament Structure

Game Type: No-Limit Texas Hold'em.

Maximum Players: 30.

Buy-In: C\$500 minimum up to C\$1000 maximum per player.

Starting Chips: 5,000 / 10,000 chips.

Rebuy Period: Unlimited rebuys allowed during the first 90 minutes.

Blinds Structure:

First 90 minutes: Blinds are set at 50/100 and do not increase during this period.

At the end of the 90 minute rebuy period there will be a 15 minute break for players to purchase chips and reorganise to new tables if necessary.

After 90 minutes blinds start at 100/200 and double every 30 minutes (e.g., 200/400, 400/600, etc.).

Payout Structure for top 10 players

1. **1st Place:** 32%
2. **2nd Place:** 22%
3. **3rd Place:** 16%
4. **4th Place:** 12%
5. **5th Place:** 10%
6. **6th Place:** 8%

2. Rebuy Rules

Rebuy Period: Unlimited rebuys are allowed during the first 90 minutes.

Rebuy Limit: Players can rebuy up to the 10,000 chip limit, even if they still have chips remaining.

Example: If a player has 1,000 chips, they can rebuy 9,000 chips to reach the 10,000 chip limit.

Rebuy Cost: Each rebuy costs the same as the original buy-in (C\$500 to C\$1,000).

End of Rebuy Period: After the first 90 minutes no further rebuys are allowed.

3. Gameplay Rules

Table Assignments: Players will be randomly assigned to seats and tables with numbers picked from a hat. The tournament starts with tables of max 10 players.

Chip Structure: C\$500 = 5,000 chips in value and a total of 30 chips.

White 50 (10), Red 100 (8), Green 200 (6), Blue 500 (4), Black 1,000 (2), Purple 2,000 (0)

Eliminations: When a player loses all their chips and cannot rebuy (after the first 90 min), they are out of the tournament.

Players will be relocated as necessary to keep player numbers balanced at the tables, the last person that dealt will be the person relocated to the button position on their new table.

Final Table: When 10 players remain, they will merge into a single final table. There will be a 10 minute break when the tables merge.

The winners: Play continues until one player has all the chips and payout can occur as participants enter the competition in their winning positions.

Dealing: Players will deal for themselves, or a designated dealer can be used if preferred.

4. House Rules

Time Limits: Players have a reasonable time (e.g., 90 - 120 seconds) to make decisions. A clock may be used to enforce this rule.

Breaks: A 15 minute break will be taken after the first 90 minutes when rebuys end and blinds increase. A second 10 minute break will be taken when the tables merge

Behavior: All players are expected to behave respectfully. Unsportsmanlike conduct may result in penalties or disqualification.

5. Prizes

Distribution: Prizes are awarded to the top 6 players based on the payout structure.

Payouts: All payouts are made in cash (Córdobas) at the end of the tournament.
